Chetham's is the largest specialist music school in the UK and is the only one based in the north of England, with equally 'excellent' musical and academic results.

Entry to the School is based solely on musical ability or potential, never on background or ability to pay, thanks to the Government's Music and Dance Scheme and other bursaries.

Our academic results far exceed the national average, while musically our network of partnerships with professional orchestras and organisations extends across the music industry, and our alumni populate orchestras and ensembles across the world.

Based in the heart of Manchester, Chetham's state-of-the-art New School Building includes an acoustically designed concert venue, The Stoller Hall, offering priceless opportunities for student performances and professional concerts.

Parents, we promise to do the very best for your child, musically, academically, and socially. We'll guide them to new challenges as people, as learners and as players. We'll watch over them as they make new friends, discover a new city, and move towards a professional future - whether that takes them to the concert platform, or to success in another sphere. Music

At Chetham's, music is at the heart of all we do.

Every student receives individual lessons in first and second study instruments, in addition to ensemble rehearsals, structured practice time and academic music classes.

From day one, life at Chetham's helps every musician to find their own musical pathways, to develop as a performer and professional, and potentially to go on to a hugely successful career.

Students apply to Chetham's as members of one of eight musical departments. In a community steeped in music, there are always opportunities for students to explore new instruments, join a jazz improvisation class, or try their hand at composition.

Every student's week is individually timetabled to support both musical and academic interests.

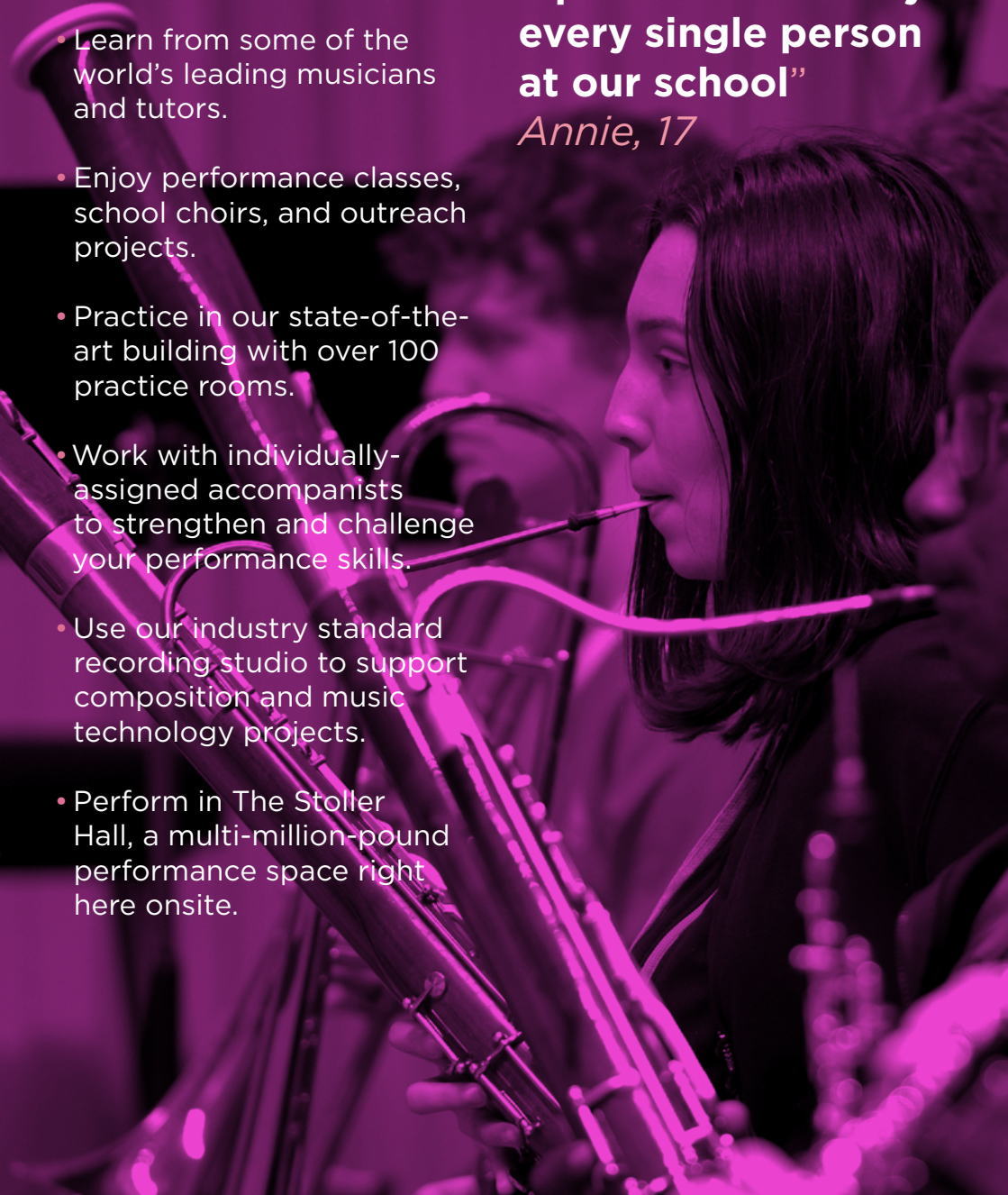



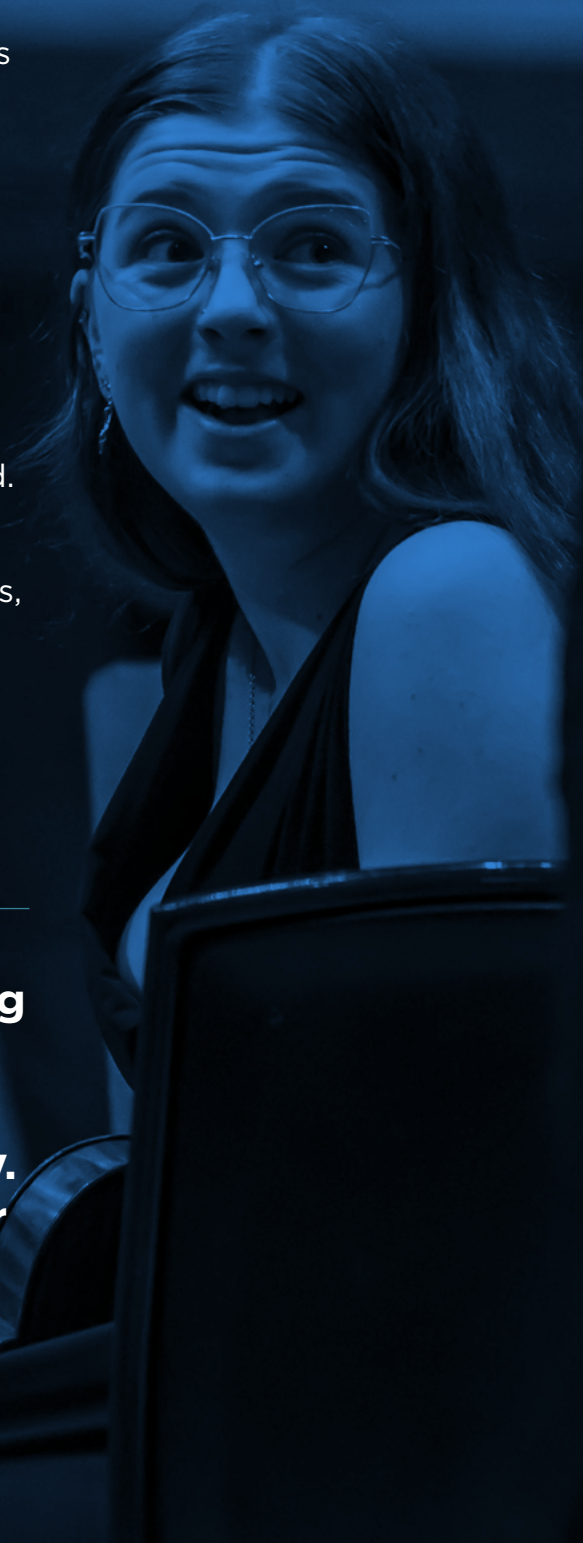
Our safeguarding procedures are rigorous, individually assigned tutors provide academic mentoring, and teachers always make time to see students if they need individual support.

Lower School

What is a music school?

It's a place where everyone loves music and enjoys playing an instrument. At music school, you'll learn all the subjects you normally would at any other school, like maths, science and English, but you also get to do at least two hours of music every day, including lessons, concerts, singing and more!



Boarding

If you choose to board with us in Lower School, you will join Victoria House, which is just for children like you, aged 8-13.

You'll share a room with two or three other children in your year, so you'll always be surrounded by friends.

You'll be looked after by a friendly team of House Staff. They'll always be on hand to help you with whatever you need and keep in touch with your parents too.

Fun!

You'll usually be busy during the school days, but when you do have free time there are always fun things for you to do.

There are clubs almost every day after school, like baking, crafting, and our very own 1st Chetham's Scouts group.

At the weekends, you can sign up to go out on fun trips like playing mini golf, visiting water parks, and loads more fun activities.

Plus, Victoria House has a big common room complete with board games, DVDs, crafts, and computers, so you'll find it hard to get bored!



Music

When you start at school here, you'll be assigned teachers for each of your instruments who you will have individual lessons with each week, and you'll have lots of time to practice in your daily timetable. We even have Practice Assistants to help you.

You'll make music with other young people just like you, and you'll even get to perform in concerts. Our Lower School Orchestra features all orchestral instruments, while Violetta is just for string players. You'll also be part of a small ensemble for your instrument group, like a piano duo or a string quartet, so you'll always have opportunities to make music with friends.

Learning

In Year 4 and 5, you'll be learning together in one classroom taught by Miss Tomlinson in Junior Class, so you won't need to worry about finding your way around school for every lesson.

As you get a bit older and join Year 6, you'll be in a new class taught by Mr Wong and start working towards going into Key Stage 3.

From Year 7, you'll start having different teachers for each subject as you begin Key Stage 3.

Middle School

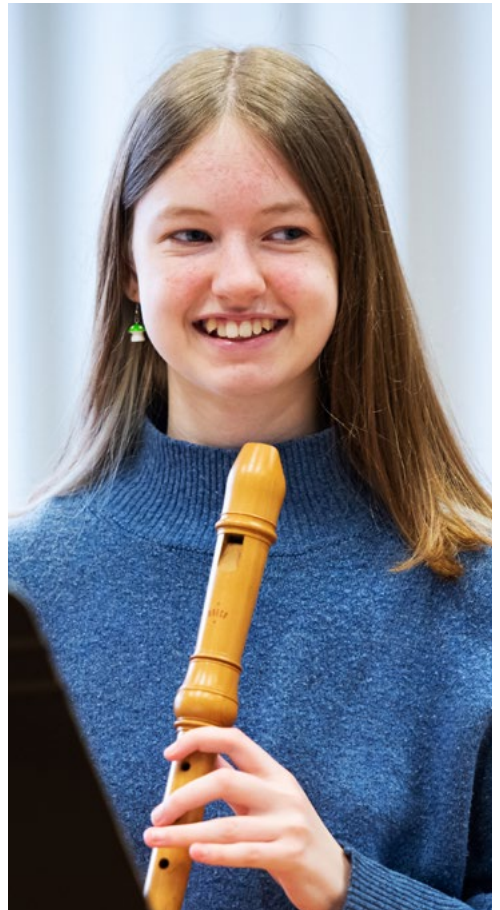

Independence

We're based right in the centre of Manchester - an exciting city full of things to see and things to do. From Year 9 onwards, you will be allowed to go out into Manchester in groups with your friends after school and at weekends.

Boarding

As a boarding student, you will live in either New College House or Millgate House, open to students from Year 9. Most Middle School dorm rooms will accommodate four students, which means that you will always have the option to be around friends. The boarding houses offer optional activities to take part in most days but also give you the space to be a bit more independent if you prefer. There's always an adult around if you need a grown up, too.

Learning

You'll learn just like in any other school, choosing GCSE options in Year 9 and sitting exams in Year 11. Alongside that, you'll spend 2-3 hours making music every day - including individual lessons, rehearsals, choirs, and music theory classes.

Music

Chetham's Sinfonia is our orchestra for students in Middle School, which plays three concerts a year and has recently performed pieces including The Firebird and music from Harry Potter! Dependent on your instrument, you might also join Big Band, Chamber Choir, Guitar Ensemble, Saxophone Choir, Serenata Strings, and many more ensembles in each department. With daily Lunchtime Concerts and weekly performance classes, you can perform with your chamber group or accompanist when you have a new piece ready to share.

You'll work with some of the world's best musicians and learn to make music to a professional standard. We'll help you learn to take responsibility for your performance, your equipment and your time.

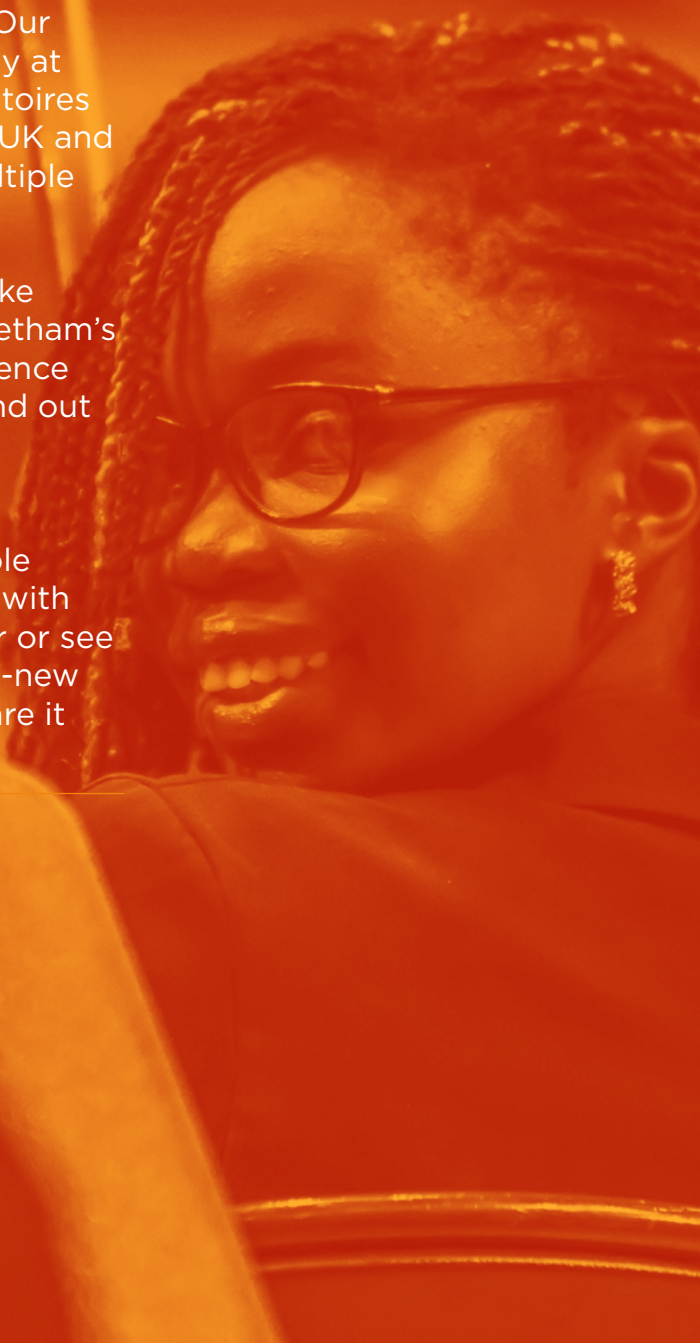

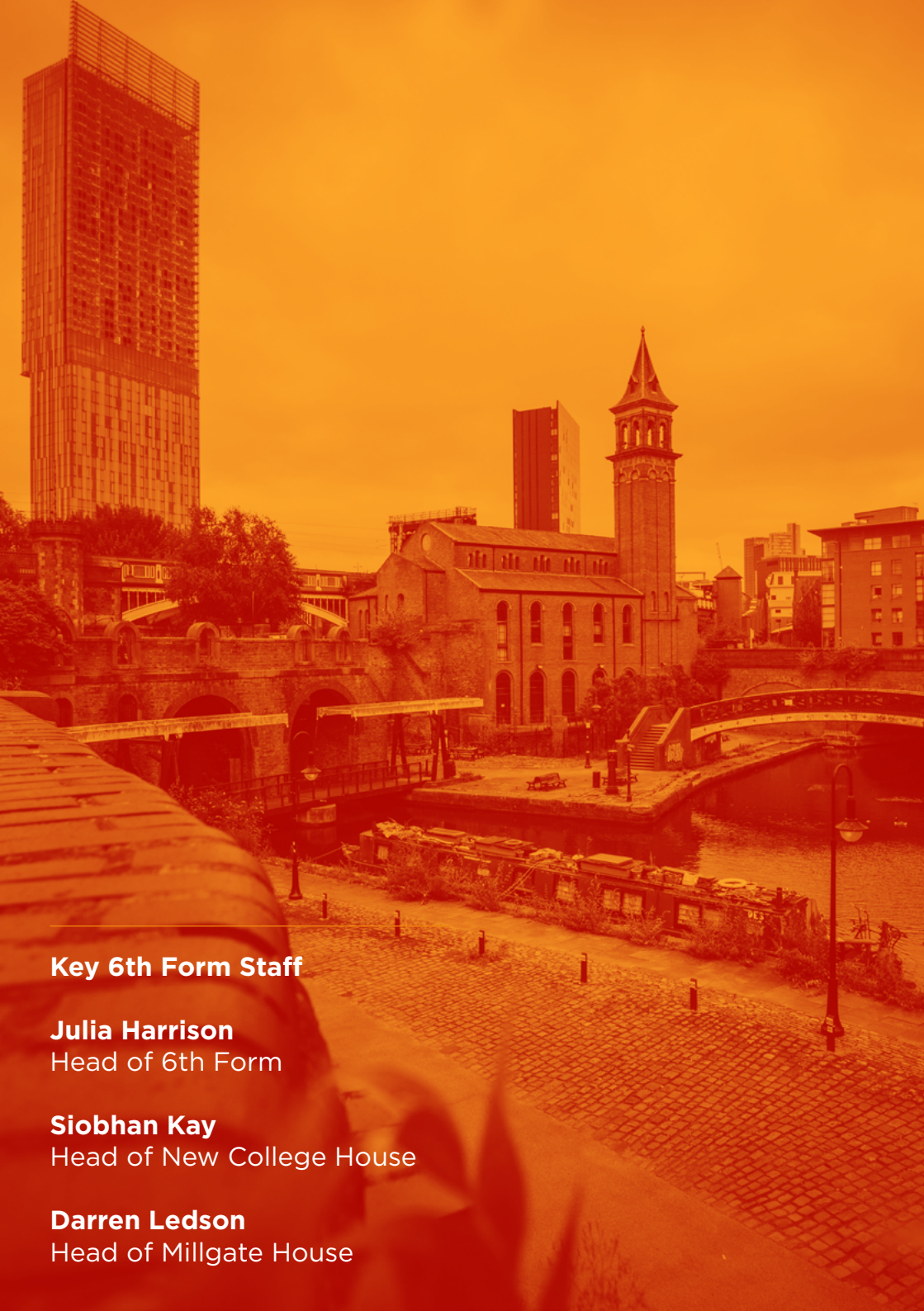
Year on year, our exam results are outstanding, regularly achieving 100% pass rates and more than 70% A*-B.

International Students

Across the school, more than 20 languages are spoken by students of 16 different nationalities.

Every international student receives one to one support with English language and study skills.

A friendly, diverse boarding environment means students quickly fit in and pick up English from new friends.

Many staff are also from overseas - we recruit the best musicians and teachers, wherever they can be found.

Applying from overseas

Admission is purely on musical potential and there are no academic entry requirements. However, it is important that Chetham's can provide a suitable course for your needs, both academically and musically.

International applicants are therefore also asked to provide details of current educational achievements and the subjects they would like to study at Chetham's. Evidence of fluency in both written and spoken English is also required.

Visas

If you are a non-UK student, it is likely that you will need to have a visa to study at Chetham's. The School is a Highly Trusted Sponsor and if you are eligible we will be able to provide a sponsorship number for you to use when applying for your visa.

English Language Skills

Students in the Sixth Form must be able to demonstrate competency in English language at or above CEFR level B1.

If English is not your first language, you will receive support from the Compensatory Education team whilst studying at Chetham's. Through one-to-one sessions, staff will assess your English language ability, and support you in developing grammatical and communication skills, and overcoming differences in understanding arising from linguistic or cultural divides.

Students are offered support to prepare for the International English Language Test System (IELTS) which is usually a requirement for university or conservatoire entrance.

Guardians

Every student whose parents live or work outside the UK must have a guardian. Students will usually visit this guardian for short breaks such as Free Weekends or in case of illness; and the guardian may respond on behalf of parents to educational or medical issues requiring urgent attention.

Funding for international students

Students with non-UK passports may be eligible for a grant through the Music and Dance scheme if they have lived in the UK for a prescribed period of time.

Students with UK passports, but who live abroad, may or may not be offered a grant depending on their residential status.

Students living outside the EU and with non-EU passports are not eligible for an MDS grant and are classed as fee-paying students.



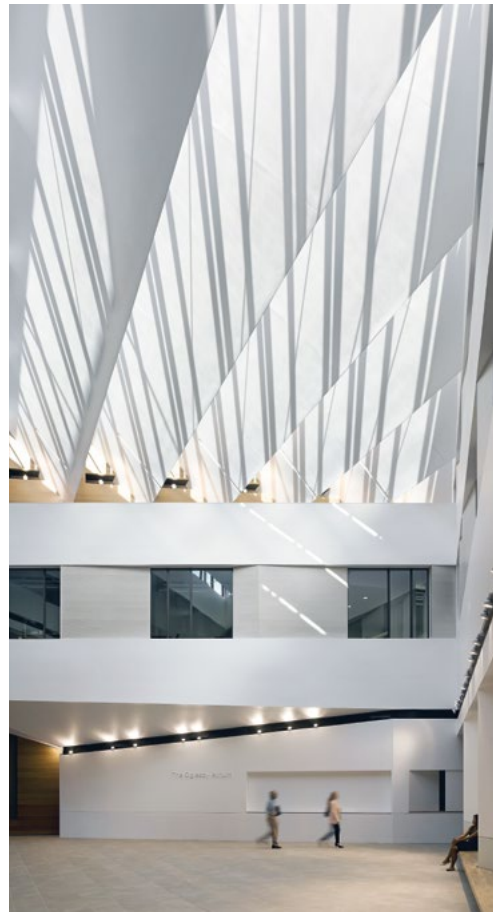
Fees & Funding

Around 85% of Chetham's students receive full or partial funding through the Department for Education

What matters at Chetham's is musical potential, not background or ability to pay. We are one of nine schools within the UK Government's Music & Dance Scheme, designed to enable young, talented musicians and dancers to receive full time education and training at a specialist school irrespective of parents' financial means.

If you are offered a place at Chetham's and qualify for the Music and Dance Scheme, your parents will be asked to provide their income details to the Bursar who will then calculate what their annual contribution to the fees will be. As a rough guide, if your parents earn less than £20,000 per year they will pay only £582 a year towards your boarding fees and education. If your parents earn over £200,000 a year then they will be asked to pay full fees. Everyone in between has to contribute on a sliding scale, shown on the back page of this leaflet.

This scheme does not apply to Choristers or overseas students, except for EU students aged 16 and over. Choristers should speak to Manchester Cathedral about the support available towards their fees. Please visit our website for full details of eligibility, or speak to us about financial support for students not included in the scheme.
