


A music school is a place where everyone loves music and enjoys playing an instrument.

At music school, you'll learn all the subjects you normally would at any other school, like maths, science and English, but you also get to do at least two hours of music every day, including lessons, concerts, singing and more!

Boarding

If you choose to board with us in Lower School, you will join Victoria House, which is just for children like you, aged 8-13.

You'll share a room with two or three other children in your year, so you'll always be surrounded by friends.

Independence

We're based right in the centre of Manchester an exciting city full of things to see and things to do. From Year 9 onwards, you will be allowed to go out into Manchester in groups with your friends after school and at weekends.

Boarding

As a boarding student, you will live in either New College House or Millgate House, open to students from Year 9. Most Middle School dorm rooms will accommodate four students, which means that you will always have the option to be around friends. The boarding houses offer optional activities to take part in most days but also give you the space to be a bit more independent if you prefer. There's always an adult around if you need a grown up, too.

Learning

You'll learn just like in any other school, choosing GCSE options in Year 9 and sitting exams in Year 11. Alongside that, you'll spend 2-3 hours making music every day – including individual lessons, rehearsals, choirs, and music theory classes.

Music

Chetham's Philharmonic is our orchestra for students in Middle School, which plays three concerts a year and has recently performed pieces including The Firebird and music from Harry Potter! Dependent on your instrument, you might also join Big Band, Chamber Choir, Guitar Ensemble, Saxophone Choir, Serenata Strings, and many more ensembles in each department. With daily Lunchtime Concerts and weekly performance classes, you can perform with your chamber group or accompanist when you have a new piece ready to share.

Fees and Funding



Chetham's School of Music For UK students Fees and Funding

What matters at Chetham's is musical potential, not ability to pay.

Around 90% of Chetham's students receive full or partial funding. We are one of nine schools within the UK Government's Music & Dance Scheme, designed to enable young, talented musicians and dancers to receive full time education and training at a specialist school irrespective of parents' financial means.

If your child is offered a place at Chetham's and qualify for the Music and Dance Scheme, you will be asked to provide your income details to the Finance Director who will then calculate what your annual contribution to the fees will be. As a rough guide, if you earn £20,000 per year you will pay only £567 a year towards boarding fees and education. If you earn over £200,000 a year then you be asked to pay full fees. Everyone in between has to contribute on a sliding scale, shown opposite.

This scheme does not apply to Choristers or overseas students. Choristers should speak to Manchester Cathedral about the support available towards their fees. Please visit our website for full details of eligibility, or speak to us about financial support for students not included in the scheme.

International Students



Chetham's School of Music International Students

Across the school, more than 40 languages are spoken by students of 16 different nationalities.

Chetham's is a truly international community. Around 10% of our students have joined us from overseas, and over forty languages are spoken across the School.

This diversity, both within school and in the wider community across Manchester's vibrant city centre, encourages a natural awareness and acceptance of different views, beliefs, and cultures.

Applying from overseas

We warmly welcome applications from all over the world.

If your application progresses to an interview with our audition panel and you are not yet confident about conversing in English, please try to have someone with you who can help the conversation to flow, as this should be an enjoyable opportunity for you to ask as well as answer questions.

Admission is based primarily on musical potential, yet we offer a very strong academic programme which all students follow. You will follow the UK system of GCSEs or A- Levels. Non-UK Resident applicants are asked to provide details of current educational achievements and the subjects they would like to study at Chetham's.

Visas

If you are a non-UK student – or an EU student without settled or pre-settled status – it is likely that you will need to have a visa to study at Chetham's.

The School has a Student Sponsor license and if you are eligible, we will be able to provide a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies sponsorship number for you to use when applying for your visa.

If you are aged up to and including 15 you will have to apply for a Child Student visa. This also applies if you are 16 or 17 but will be primarily studying at GCSE level.

If you are 16 or 17 and will be studying A levels, you can choose whether to apply for a Child Student visa or a Student visa.

If you are 18 you must apply for a Student visa.

English Language skills

Students who plan to apply for a Student visa must be able to demonstrate competency in English language at or above CEFR level B1. For more information, please visit the UK Border Agency website or contact the School.

If English is not your first language, you will receive support from the Compensatory Education team and English Departments whilst studying at Chetham's. Through small groups - or one to one sessions at a extra charge - staff will assess your English language ability, support you in developing grammatical and communication skills, and help you to overcome differences in understanding arising from linguistic or cultural divides.

Students are offered support to prepare for the International English Language Test System (IELTS) which is usually a requirement for university or conservatoire entrance.

Guardians

Every student whose parents live or work outside the UK must have a guardian. Students will visit this guardian for short breaks such as Free Weekends or in case of illness; and the guardian may respond on behalf of parents to educational or medical issues requiring urgent attention. The Guardian needs to be within two hours drive of Manchester. We recommend that the Guardian is either a close family member or certified Guardian through an accredited agency.

Bursaries for overseas students

Each year we have a very small number of bursaries that we award to exceptional students from overseas. The amount of funding is determined by the School and is for one year only. Overseas bursaries are based on parental income which will need to be provided.

Short visits and summer schools

Students applying from overseas may be able to arrange short residential stays in school as a trial boarder, helping them to make a final decision about studying at Chetham's. During these visits you will get to know fellow students and the school day, meet pastoral staff, and take part in the music and academic programme. Trial visits generally last no more than one week and should be arranged with the Auditions Administrator, usually after a successful Main Audition.

Funding for international students

(including EU residents)
